1. Pursuant to DepEd Order No. 006, s. 2026, titled "*Guidelines on Ensuring a Safe and Motivating Environment*," and Division Memorandum No. 250, s. 2026, dated March 14, 2026, titled "*Reiteration of the Implementation of the DepEd's Anti-Bullying Policy and Dissemination of Bullying Prevention IEC Materials in Schools*," all public elementary and secondary schools are hereby directed to continue implementing the provisions of these issuances and ensure the compliance with the prescribed policies and standards.

REITERATION OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DEPED'S ANTI-BULLYING POLICY AND DISSEMINATION OF BULLYING PREVENTION IEC MATERIALS IN SCHOOLS

1. Pursuant to the Memorandum OM-OUOPS-2026-13-1137, titled "*Urgent Reiteration of the Implementation of the DepEd's Anti-Bullying Policy and Dissemination of Bullying Prevention IEC Materials in Schools*," this Office reiterates the following DepEd initiatives in support of the Department's zero-tolerance policy against all forms of abuse, violence, and bullying, and in strengthening the implementation of DepEd's policy on child protection and bullying prevention:

- Enhanced Localized Anti-Bullying Policy;
- Posting of Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) Material;
- Reminders During Flag Raising Ceremonies and Daily Announcements;
- Installation of CCTV in the School's Common Areas;
- Implementation of Random Bag Inspection to Deter the Bringing of Potential Weapons or Contraband; and
- Accessibility of the Learners' TeleSafe Contact Center Helpline and the Establishment of the Regional Learners' TeleSafe Helpline.

2. This Office requests all concerned schools and personnel to extend the necessary technical assistance, coordination, and administrative support to ensure the effective and sustained implementation of these measures.

Gender-Based - refers to any act that humiliates or excludes a person on the basis of perceived or actual sexual orientation and gender identity

Cyber Bullying - any bullying done through the use of technology or any electronic means (texting, email, chatting, online games, etc.)
